Sree Siddaganga Math has become a unique Gurukula providing education to more than 9000 poor children with free food and shelter, without any discrimination of caste or creed.

Dr. Sree Sree Sivakumara Swamiji, the present head of the Math was initiated into viraktashrama order in 1930. The driving forces behind Sree Swamiji's more than seven decades of fruitful service to humanity are hardwork, disciplined life, faith in humanity and sincerity of purpose to help the poor and the downtrodden.

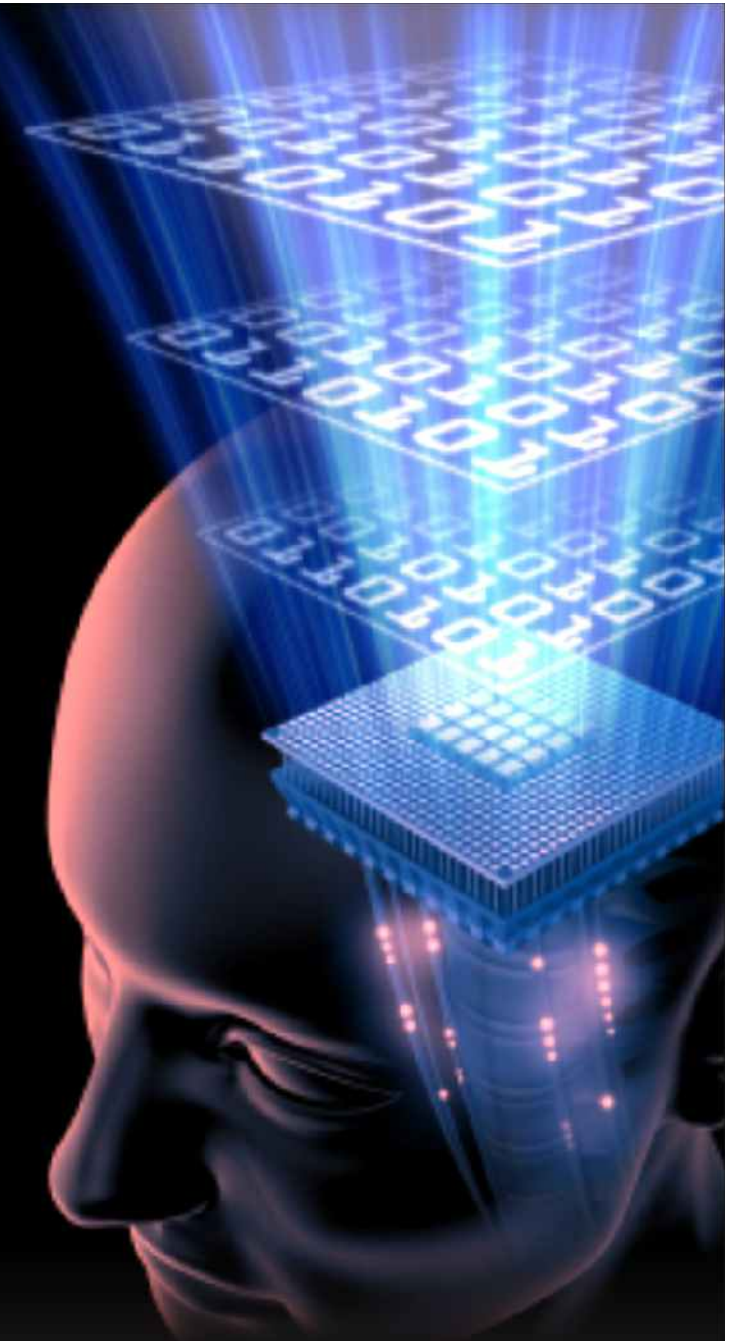

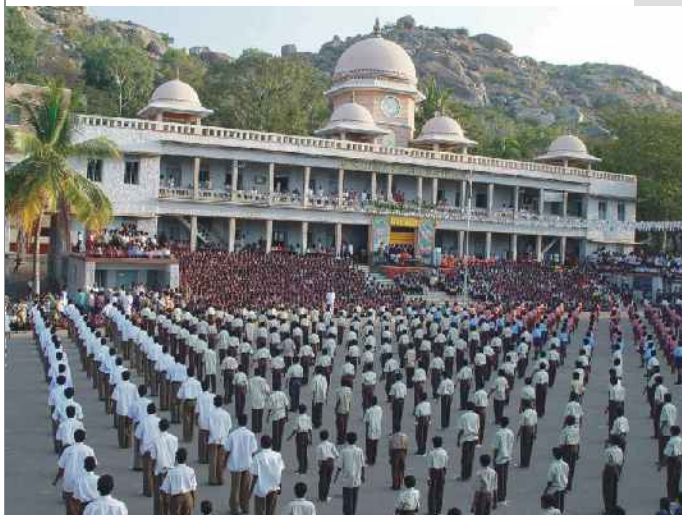
A Tumkur Panorama



Shivagange is an ancient historical holy place, and is called "Southern Kashi" of India. It has rich a religious background with both Shaiva & Veerashaiva traditions. The temple built on the magnificent hill in the Chalukyan Style is dedicated to Lord Gangadhareshwara & Honnadevi. It is believed that there are more than one lakh holy idols in & around the hill.

About Organizers

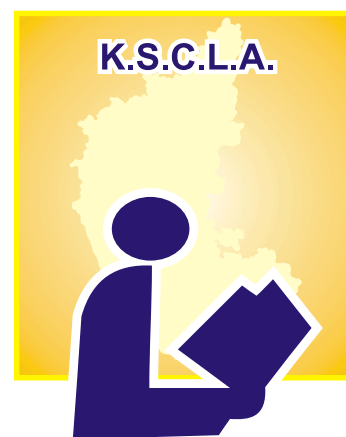

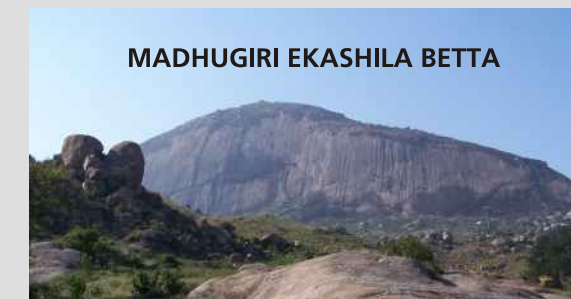

The Kote Anjaneyaswamy temple is one of the oldest historical temples in the city. The temple of Anjaneyaswamy was constructed in Hoysala style. The biggest arch & idol of Sri Anjaneyaswamy with Rama, Lakshmana in standing style is an exclusive construction. It is 75 feet in height and in Belur style.



Madhugiri is a prosperous town surrounded by hills. The biggest single rock hill in Asia at 1192mtrs. The fort "Giridurga" and temple situated at the hill built by Hiriya Chikkappa Gowda. It has one of the finest hill forts in the state. Marataas & Mysore kings have ruled this place. Also at Madhugiri are several wells such as Jainayana bavi, the Arasana bavi & the Pradhanara bavi. These wells are beautifully decorated. It was here that the queen of Keladi, Veerammaji & her Son were exiled by Haider Ali, in 1763.



Conference Theme

The concept of Knowledge Management evolved out of Industry and Business has adequately entered Library and Information Science, due the identical functions; creation, organizing, transmission, dissemination and utilization of knowledge have been an identical function of both the domains. The first practical classification system developed in the late 19th century triggered a consistent and persistent research interest in the area. The cataloguing particularly subject cataloguing added a new dimension to the concept of knowledge organization. In the present context these two areas of the past have been transformed into Knowledge Organization systems in the digital environment especially in the content organization of digital libraries. The subjects and components of KOS, metadata, taxonomies, ontology and semantic web are constantly being researched in the present electronic and digital environment and hence the theme of the conference is of importance to all those who are engaged and involved in knowledge organization. Situated amidst hills & dense forest Devarayana Durga has various holy spots like the temple of Durga (fort) Narasimha built by the Mysore rulers in the Dravidian style. The sanjeevaraya Temple dedicated to Hanuma & the temple of Kumbi Narasimha are the other temples. There are three sacred ponds called Narasimha teertha, Parashara teertha & the Pada teertha. The Pada teertha is inside a large cave. There is another cave with the statues of lord Rama, His consort Seetha & his brother Lakshmana. In 1696 Chikkadevaraya Wodeyar took over this region. There after this place was named after him as Devarayana Durga.



Namada Chilume is a famous hill station. The legend of Rama & Seetha is associated with this place. The river Jayamangali and the shimsha originate from these hill ranges. The place is quite cool in summer. Recently the forest department has developed the DEER SANTUARY & "OWSHADI VANA" (Medicinal garden) in this place which is beautiful picnic spot for nature lovers.

Manuscripts Requirements

Length: : Not more than 10 pages, hence the authors are advised to package core thought of the paper, \ rather dealing more elaborately on definitions and meanings etc., unless it is quite essential

Theme Font : Times New Roman

Font Size : Heading-20, Sub Heading -16, and rest of the text-12 and single spacing

Title : The title should be concise.

Paper Format: The paper should have the following details:

- ◆ Sub-Theme of the paper to which the paper belongs to Author's / Co-Author's name, Communication address
- ◆ Contact details such as telephone number and email
- ◆ An abstract of 100-150 words along with 6-8 key words
- ◆ Headings & sub headings should be defined clearly and short
- ◆ Page numbers should not be given in any case.
- ◆ Case Studies proposed may preferably be supported by real life case examples from business/academic situations
- ◆ Quality of Illustrations, Photos etc. must be good with original caption and in black and white
- ◆ Tables and Figures, if any must have a brief caption written on the bottom of the figure and provide the due reference of the original work.

References must be in standard format as given below:

For Books : Author (Name/Surname, initials), Year of Publication, Title, Publisher, Place of publication.

For Journals : Author, A., & Author, B. (Year). Article title. Title of Periodical, Vol (Issue), pp-pp

For URL : Author, A., & Author, B. (Year). Title of the webpage. Retrieved from <http://...> [Accessed on Date, Month & Year].

The Church has a history of 157 years and is a hub for Eight other churches of the city. Church is located in the heart of the city and is a centre of public attraction. In the sixth decade of last century, coaching programmes in music, discussion on social, religious and Christianity were conducted by the church. The prayer and chanting team of the church is very popular in the city.



Bijapur kingdom fell to Aurangzeb, Dilwar Khan was appointed governor of Sirsa. He then built a fine palace here which is said to have inspired the palaces of Bangalore & Srirangapatana. He also laid out a beautiful garden that is said to have been the model for the Lal Bagh garden at Bangalore. A monument worth seeing is the Ibrahim Rauza that contains many tombs, built in the Hindu style of architecture, except for its minarets, this building has cornices & doorways with Hindu motifs.
